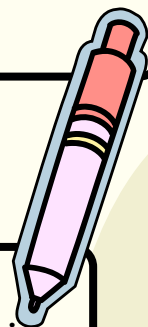
Dear parents and carers,

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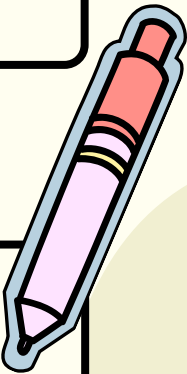
Reading



Reading is important for every child. We have daily reading practice groups for all students. These small groups support students to read at their level and answer comprehension questions about what they have read. All students at school have a reading age. If you would like to know more and are interested in appropriate reading age level books for your son or daughter please contact your tutor in the first instance and we will look to provide the information.

Year groups read specific class reading books for their literacy. This term in KS3, Year 7 are reading Planet Omar, Year 8 are reading Twitch and Year 9 are reading Holes. A number of students receive phonic interventions using Fresh Start.
